For example, if I divide 20 by 4 to get 5, I can check by multiplying 5 by 4 to see that it equals 20. 3. True 4. common 5. We can use division to share resources fairly among family members or friends, ensuring everyone gets an equal amount. For example, if we have 12 cookies and 4 friends, we can divide them so that each friend gets 3 cookies. This promotes fairness and sharing. 6. God's sense of justice 7. False 8. fairly 9.
